### Minutes of May 7, 2019

#### Record of Proceedings

Special meeting of the Washington Township Board of Trustees was held at the Washington Township Administration Building, 6200 Eiterman Road, Dublin, Ohio, on May 7, 2019, at 6:30 p.m. Meeting was called to order by Mr. Charles Kranstuber, Chair, and the meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Kranstuber welcomed the audience and he introduced the members of staff and the Board of Trustees.


The Township Trustees held a special meeting for the purpose of addressing concerns of the residents in the Village of Amlin, Washington Township, Rings Road, Dublin Ohio. The Board of Trustees directed staff to develop and distribute a survey to get the input as to what residents would like see done with the development and possible any help the Township could offer to help make Amlin a better place to live and then see what contributions the residents could do to help make that happen. Mr. Kranstuber stated the Board has seen some issues that need addressing and hopefully get those things taken care of. The Board has scheduled a community clean up event on May 18<sup>th</sup> and May 19<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Eric Richter, Township Administrator stated Rumpke Waste Deposal will be delivering 3 large dumpsters to the alley beside the old pizza shop in Amlin, to assist with the deposal of solid waste materials, yard waste and tires/rims. The dumpsters will be delivered Friday, May 17<sup>th</sup> and will be picked up Monday, May 20<sup>th</sup>. There will be volunteers and fire fighters manning the dumpster and to help residents lift things into the dumpsters, but they will not be able to go to individuals homes to pick up items.



If you own a property, do you occupy the property you own?










How many vehicles (working and not working) do you need tohave parking space for?





#### **Residents Comments, Questions, Ideas:**

A number of residents attend this meeting and gave comments, asked questions. Most of these residents filled out this survey.

### Additional concerns:

- Storm water drains not draining, standing water and mosquitos Some feel this is because of Ballantrae Construction Project being higher elevation than Amlin, field tiles are damaged or destroyed.
- Speed on Rings Road request to reduce the speed to 25 mph and put in speed bumps.
- Need for sidewalks to be able to walk on Rings Road.
- Homes are not kept up, lawns not mowed, there is plywood in window, storage units that is a semi-truck trailer, trash on properties, not a pleasing site from Cosgray to the roundabout on Churchman Street, concern that new people moving in and don't care about their property's because they are renting property.
- Amlin Alleys need improvement, road falling apart and needs lighting.
- Traffic from Rings Road onto Cosgray Road very dangerous intersection.
- People using the alleys for parking.
- Snow plowing of Amlin alleys is dead last and the plows tear up residential properties.
- Amlin signs need to be upgraded, mowed around and landscaped.
- Amlin lighting need repairs.

Question to the Trustees: What is the Township and residents vision for Amlin? Commercial or Residential Use? From the Township Community Plan it indicated to fix it up like an old main street with commercial properties.

Mr. Kranstuber stated Townships are limited in zoning authority, but we can do better as a community as far as the esthetics, maintenance, the look, flooding, mosquitos and maybe sidewalks. To make it look better than it

does right now. To answer the question regarding the future of Amlin, we don't know if and when a developer might come in a buy up all the properties, but as far as now the Township doesn't want it to deteriorate any further and as the local government, the Township wants to help make it better but needs the residents help to get this done.

Ms. King stated the Township has a Community Plan and the community had input and it is valid until it is updated. If we hear through this process you want it update then this is a legitimate request because it has been about 15 years since the last update. Another big determinate is if there is a group of residents or land owners wanting to pursue annexing to the City of Dublin or if the Township sponsors a group annexation, then that changes who is in charge. The Township would still supply Fire and EMS, but if this area is in the City of Dublin, the Township would not supply water, sewer, sidewalks, zoning, plan approval, vision and that is why this meeting and the ones to follow are important because we are asking what direction the residents wants to take.

Ms. King stated when she goes over to Amlin she is not happy with what she sees. If you don't have your house looking as good as Mr. John Brown's house, then you are disrespectful to your neighbors and you need to clean up your act, get rid of your junk, mow your grass, trim your bushes and you need to take advantage of the dumpsters May 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>.

Mr. Kranstuber read pages 52-53 of the Washington Township Comprehensive Plan pertaining to Amlin.

Mr. Bostic stated if residents do want to annex to the City of Dublin, the City would not want to take in this area due to the condition it is currently in. The houses are old and run down. Water & sewer would not be an option to hook into.

The Next steps:

First prioritize the list that has been given, get an action plan together to keep this project moving. Bring in a land planning director or engineers, possibly one the City of Dublin has used and has history in the area. We are calling this the "Pretty It Up Amlin Campaign".
