BECOME A WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP FIREFIGHTER

STEP #1: CERTIFICATION

The Township requires all paid part-time firefighters to possess the minimum State of Ohio Firefighter II and EMT-B certifications. Many institutions offer classes / certification programs. Some institutions include, but are not limited to Tolles Technical, Delaware Area Career Center, Columbus State Community College. One learning institution is not preferred over another.

STEP #2: EXAM

Once you are within 3 months of possessing both the State of Ohio Firefighter II and EMT-B certifications (see Step #1), sign up to take the National Testing Network's FireTeams exam. To schedule the exam, please go to <https://nationaltestingnetwork.com> and follow their instructions. Once the exam is completed, please complete the Township's Personal History Questionnaire (below) and email the completed form to hr@wtwp.com.

STEP #3: PHYSICAL ABILITIES TEST

Those with a passing FireTeams exam score will be invited to participate in the Township's Physical Abilities Test. The Township typically has 2 tests per year with ample practice days to attend prior to the test. Invitations are sent electronically to the candidate's email address once a test is coordinated.

STEP #4: FIRST INTERVIEW

Candidates passing the Township's Physical Abilities Test will be invited to a panel interview comprised of current full-time firefighters and officers.

STEP #5: SECOND INTERVIEW

Candidates best fitting with the Township will be invited to a second interview with the Administrative staff.

STEP #6: BACKGROUND CHECK

Background checks are the final step in the process. Background checks include, but are not limited to a physical examination with drug screen by the Township's designated healthcare provider; BCI/FBI background, professional and personal reference checks; driving abstract; credit bureau check; education and social security number verification; mental health evaluation by the Township's designated mental health professionals; polygraph and, if applicable, a public records request from any current or previous public center employment.
